Record-breaking numbers!

We're pleased to annonunce that April - June was a recordbreaking guarter in terms of the numbers volunteering within the Library building, with 64 volunteers attending weekly.



The volunteering scheme will remain open throughout the summer; however, things will be a little guieter, what with

the exodus of students, as well as some volunteers on parenting and grandparenting duties.

Peace from across the sea:

Through the 1920s, as a result of the Great War, the Women's Committee of the Welsh League of Nations Union led campaigns on peace. In 1923, women throughout Wales organised the Women's Peace campaign which involved peace activists going door-to-door to almost every household in the country. The result was a Memorial Petition signed by 390,296 women (allegedly 7 miles long) which was shipped and presented to the women of America.

One hundred years later, the oak chest and its contents has returned to Wales. The Petition is currently being catalogued and digitised by Library staff; the digitised version will be available for online volunteers to transcribe on the Library's crowdsourcing website from November onwards.

We will soon be inviting a few of our in-house volunteers to help with a preliminary task to identify the location (town/village) of some of the names in the petition where only a street name has been recorded. This will involve searching the Census to match names and addresses.

Student placements pilot:

Due to the high number of post-graduate students of the University's Information Studies Department that signed up to volunteer over the year, a scheme offering volunteering placements within Library departments was piloted. Eight placements were offered; the feedback from both staff and students has been very positive. Three of the students have since secured employment. One of them noted that his placement with the NLW photographs curator had helped him secure employment at a museum in San Diego.

Recording the Dairy Industry in Mid Wales:

Colin has been scanning and creating data for the People's Collection Wales website recording the history of Milk Marketing Board creameries in Mid Wales. Michael Morgan's personal collection of photos, documents and ephemera record his time working at Felin Fach Creamery from 1965 - 1988, and later at Llangadog Creamery from 1988 - 2005.
