The mining papers deal chiefly with the affairs of the Ocean Coal Company, Ltd, and consist of the company's leases of mineral rights in the Rhondda, and documents connected with the sinking and management of coal-pits at Ynysybwl and in the Rhondda and Garw Valleys.

The Barry Dock group contains legal reports, petitions and evidence collected for the Barry Dock Bills of 1883 and 1884, various Acts and Bills concerning Barry Dock, a variety of papers connected with its construction and management and a collection of maps and plans of the Barry Dock and Railway.

The other two groups consist of personal papers concerning David Davies and his parliamentary career, and a collection of letter-books containing letters (1879-97) received by Edward Davies from business associates and Welsh religious bodies.

In October 1932, Major-General Grant deposited about 1,500 papers relating to Adam Ottley, Bishop of St Davids, and Adam Ottley, registrar of that diocese. He has now added to these a large archive of the manuscripts and papers of their ancestors and descendants from the end of the sixteenth century to the beginning of the nineteenth, together with nearly 2,000 deeds relating to properties in Montgomeryshire, Cheshire and Salop from the thirteenth century.

These manuscripts and papers include documents of great historical interest, especially those which relate to the Civil War and to the Revolution of 1688; some correspondence and papers which supplement the earlier portion relating to the activities of Bishop Ottley; the more personal correspondence of Adam Ottley the registrar, including some interesting letters written by him when on active service in Flanders under the Duke of Marlborough, and correspondence relating to efforts made to secure the bishopric of Hereford for his uncle, Adam Ottley; the papers of Thomas Ottley and Rev Adam Ottley, sons of the registrar; and a few papers of the Hon. Charles Cecil Cope Jenkinson, afterwards third Earl of Liverpool, including some letters relating to the activities of the British Legation at Vienna. When the male line of the Ottleys of Pitchford became extinct in 1807, the estates passed to Jenkinson.

The majority of the manuscript volumes are uniformly bound and numbered, and in an excellent state of preservation.

The numbers deposited in the National Library are:-

1. A late sixteenth-century Welsh manuscript containing a copy of *Compod Manuwel*, a tract on heraldry, chronological 'englynion', and pedigrees of North and South Wales families.
2. A collection of Welsh poetry, 'cywyddau', 'englynion', and carols in several hands of the middle of the seventeenth century. Many of the poems were composed to members of the Owen family of Porkington [Brogyntyn]. The manuscript also contains a glossary of old Welsh words.
3. A volume of 'cywyddau' by a number of Welsh poets transcribed in 1599 by Wmffre Davis for Theodore Price, MA, canon of Winchester and rector of Blechingly.
- 4-5. A transcript, made in 1624-5, presumably for Dr John Davies of Mallwyd, of a portion (A-D, E to *Indeclinabilis*) of the Latin-Welsh Dictionary of Syr Thomas ap William of Trefriw, which is now Peniarth MS 228.
6. A Welsh manuscript of the middle of the seventeenth century containing astrological tracts, vaticinatory material, religious treatises, and historical notes, in several hands, including that of 'Hari fab Llwelin ap John ap Grefedd ap Sangkin or Trallwng'.
7. A Welsh manuscript of the middle of the seventeenth century containing transcripts of poetry and prose, largely vaticinatory.
8. *Adagia Britannica*, a collection of Welsh proverbs translated into Latin by Dr John Davies of Mallwyd. The manuscript is in the autograph of Dr John Davies, with some extracts from *Boxhorn's Originum Gallicarum Liber...* and other sources added by William Maurice of Cefnybraich.

9. An early seventeenth century transcript of a Latin text of the Laws of Hywel Dda from a manuscript belonging to Dr Thomas Allen of Gloucester Hall, Oxford.

11. A volume of English poetry (1635-69), dealing largely with characters and events of the Civil War and the Protectorate.

12. A seventeenth-century transcript of a collection of Welsh poetry by various authors, in strict and free metres.

13. A volume of 'cywyddau', 'awdlau', and 'englynion' in several hands of the second quarter of the seventeenth century.

14. A transcript of Sir John Wynne's History of the Gwydir Family. It contains marginal notes written by William Vaughan of Caethley, and pedigrees by Humphrey Humphreys, Bishop of Bangor (1689-1701) and of Hereford (1701-12).

17. A thirteenth century manuscript, on vellum, of Geoffrey of Monmouth's Historia Regum Britanniae, with an incomplete French poem of the fourteenth century.

Mr Alfred J. Horwood examined the Brogyntyn library for the Historical Manuscripts Commission in 1870, and among the manuscripts described by him in the Commission's Second Report, 1871, are those numbered 1-4, 7-9, 12, 14 and 17 above.

The collection also includes a fifteenth-century manuscript of legal precedents in Norman French (No. 25), a seventeenth century volume of memoranda concerning pleas, in Latin and English (No. 26), and several unnumbered volumes, including memoranda (1627-55) by Lewis Anwyl of Park, William Owen of Porkington, and Catherine, his wife; accounts of the estate of Roger Mostyn in Montgomeryshire (1744-58); churchwardens' accounts for the parish of Sylattyn, Salop (1712-44); a copy of the charter of Oswestry (1673/4); a rental of the estate of William Owen in Merioneth (1727-36); assessments upon the parish of 'Oswaldstry' (1660); a fragment of a fifteenth-century English chronicle, etc.

The letters, over 2,000 in number, range from the end of the sixteenth century to the eighteenth and include the correspondence of the Owen family of Brogyntyn, Clennau and Glyn, the Maurices of Clennau, the Anwyls of Park, the Vaughans of Corsygedol, the Longuevilles, the Godolphins, and the Owens of Lâs Ynys. Rowland Vaughan, Ellis Wynne, Bishop Humphreys and Edward Lhuyd are represented in this collection of letters.

Among the miscellaneous documents are a group of records relating to the manor of Deuddwr, Montgomeryshire (1661-1844); an undated survey of the townships of Llanvihangel and Llantânwg in Arduwy Uchartro; and some papers relating to the port of Barmouth (1615).

The remainder of the manuscripts consists of miscellaneous letters, including a group from Dr Lewis Edwards to John Matthews, 1830-65, and a number to Rev D. O'Brien Owen, 1883-4; a number of sermons by Owen Hughes, Amlwch; Dafydd Howells, Abergele; John Roberts, Tai Hen; Cadwaladr Owen, Dolwyddelan; William Morris, Cilgerran; and others chapel registers and account books, including the baptismal register 'of the Church of God at Bristol', 1808-83 (i.e., Broadmead Welsh Chapel), the baptismal register of the church at Llanpumpsaint, 1810-73, the Bethesda Chapel church book, 1815-61, an account book of Chapel Gwynne Society, Pantgwyn, 1814-47, and an account book of a chapel in North Cardiganshire, 1863-74; a number of minute books, including Ebenezer Richard's minutes of Associations, 1821-30, minutes of Capel Trefdraeth, 1839-47, the minute book of the Cwm Rhondda District Meetings, 1871-82, minutes of the Llanely District Meetings, 1874-97, and the North Wales English Conference Minute Book, 1882-91; copies of hymns and letters of Ann Griffiths; autograph sermons, letters, and poetry of 'Islwyn'; autograph hymns of Ben Davies, 'Pedrog', 'Elfed', 'Moelwyn', 'Nantlais', 'Gwili', 'Job', J. The printed section consists mainly of theological, biographical and historical works, bound volumes of periodicals and a large number of pamphlets containing chapel reports and statistics.

There are also numerous blocks and photographs of ministers, a few maps and the plans of Tabernacle Chapel, Aberystwyth.

Over 570 deeds, documents, and plans (1455-1895) relating largely to the Caenest estate in Merioneth and Anglesey, and to other properties in Anglesey, Caernarvonshire, Denbighshire, Merioneth and Montgomeryshire.

The plans include two volumes of surveys, made about 1770, of the Caenest and Pencraig estates. A number of late eighteenth century building leases illustrate the growth of the port of Amlwch. A counterpart of a lease of land for the building of a Calvinistic Methodist Chapel at Llanerchymedd in 1818 is signed by John Elias and other notable leaders of that denomination in the county. There is a copy of the rental of the forest of Snowdon in 1579, and two documents relating to Ellis Wynne of Lâs Ynys, one being a copy of a will which he made in 1731, and the other a promissory note by John

Owen of Caernarvon, mercer, which refers to a dispute arising out of the apprenticeship of Ellis Wynne's son.

Disgrifiad / Description

THE WYNNSTAY MANUSCRIPTS AND DOCUMENTS, consisting of over 100 literary, historical and legal manuscript volumes written in Latin, Norman-French, Welsh and English from the fifteenth century to the eighteenth, and some thousands of manorial and other records from the fourteenth century to the nineteenth.

The general manuscripts, which have already been catalogued, include collections of Welsh poetry and prose by some well-known scribes:- Thomas ap William of Trefriw; John Price of Mellteyrn; Owen Gruffydd of Llanystumdwy; William Elias, agent to the Wynnes of Glynllifon; Michael Prichard of Llanllyfni; and Hugh Hughes, 'Y Bardd Coch o Fôn'. Most of these manuscripts formerly belonged to Rev. Owen Jones of Llandudno, 'Meudwy Môn,' (1806-89), the compiler of Ceinion Llenyddiaeth Gymreig, etc., and reached Wynnstay after the disastrous fire of 1858. The remainder of the Welsh manuscripts represents the remains of the library of William Maurice of Cefnybraich which was destroyed in 1858. Apart from a fifteenth century copy of the Laws of Hywel Dda, these manuscripts consist of transcripts made by, and for, William Maurice from various sources including manuscripts which are now in the Peniarth collection. Their survival appears to be due to the fact that they had been borrowed by Henry Petrie (1768-1842), whose project for the publication of a corpus of material for

the early history of Britain was partly accomplished by the publication of the first volume of *Monumenta Historica Britannica* under the direction of Sir T. Duffus Hardy in 1848, and by Aneurin Owen, whose *Ancient Laws and Institutes of Wales*, published in 1841, formed a part of Petrie's scheme. Owen returned the manuscripts in 1851, but presumably they were not restored to their original place in the Wynnstay library. It is to be regretted that these volumes do not contain more transcripts of manuscripts that have now been lost to us, such as the 'White Book of Hergest', which was destroyed by fire while in the hands of a Covent Garden binder in the early years of the nineteenth century.

There are also numerous manuscripts of a legal nature in Latin, Norman-French and English, including tracts on forest laws, copies of treatises such as the *Dialogus de Scaccario*, a treatise of the Court of Star Chamber, Sir John Davies's *Argument upon Impositions*, *The Mirror of Justices*, extracts from Year Books and Law Reports and a number of collections of legal precedents; a few rentals, including rentals of the Thelwall estates written by the Welsh poet Simwnt Fychan in 1575 and 1576; the first account roll of the chamberlain of Chester, Feb. 7, 1300/1, to Michaelmas, 1301, and the account books of Simon Thelwall at the Exchequer of North Wales, 1554-8; account books of members of the Vaughan family of Llwydiarth, Montgomeryshire, in the seventeenth century, and of Sir William Williams of Llanvorda, 1721-39; and accounts of collieries and brickworks at Trefarclawdd, Llanvorda and Overley Hall, 1800-30.

The names of the different owners of the manuscripts indicate their provenance and illustrate the growth of the House of Wynnstay. Many of the legal manuscripts were the property of Henry Wynn, Solicitor-General to Queen Henrietta Maria, and a son of Sir John Wynn of Gwydir, while some of the manuscripts belonged to his father-in-law, Ellis Lloyd of Rhiwgoch. His son, Sir John Wynn of Rhiwgoch, acquired Watstay (now Wynnstay) through his wife, the heiress of Eyton Evans, and, leaving no issue, bequeathed his estates to Watkin Williams, son of Sir William Williams of Llanvorda, Bart, and grandson of Speaker Williams, who is represented in this collection by a few of his college notebooks. There is a notebook of Watkin Kyffin of Glascoed, the father-in-law of Speaker Williams, whilst the account books of the family of Thelwall of Plas-y-Ward recall the marriage of Sir William Williams and the heiress of Edward Thelwall. The account books of the Vaughans of Llwydiarth were acquired through the marriage of the first Sir Watkin Williams-Wynn to the heiress of Edward Vaughan of Llwydiarth.

The manorial records, which are now being arranged and catalogued by Dr E. A. Lewis, consist of court rolls, presentments, estreats of fines, surveys and subsidiary documents relating to the following manors and boroughs in Denbighshire and Montgomeryshire:-

The miscellaneous documents and papers, which have not yet been fully examined, include a few Wynn of Gwydir letters, some papers which belonged to Speaker Williams, papers relating to Parliamentary elections and to proceedings in Parliament, a few Montgomeryshire Quarter Sessions files between 1613 and 1640, ministers' accounts for the counties of Anglesey, Caernarvon and Flint in the fifteenth and sixteenth centuries, and Machynlleth fair toll-books, 1749-50.
