There are also a few unbound letters of appreciation of his books and radio programmes from Cassie Davies, 1949, Arthur ap Gwynn, 1947, E. Tegla Davies, 1947, George M. Ll. Davies, 1948, Meredydd Evans, 1949, Idris Ll. Foster, 1949, Dr. Ifan H. Jones, 1949, T. Gwynn Jones, 1946-7, R. Williams Parry, 1949, Mrs. Mary Silyn Roberts, 1949, W. H. Roberts, 1949, R. J. Rowlands, 1949, and Emlyn Williams, 1948.

The volumes of press cuttings connected with W. Anthony Davies include fourteen volumes of his Welsh column in the News Chronicle written under the name of 'Llygad Llwhwr' 1947-52, 1954-5, two volumes of his 'Llythyr Deheuwr' published in Y Cymro, 1955-9, and several volumes of miscellaneous cuttings. The correspondence includes twenty-six letters and postcards, 1916-23 and 1931, from Eluned Morgan, and smaller groups from Goronwy Charles, Queensferry, 1959 (relating to T. Owen Charles), W. Glasnant Jones, 1937-41, Rev H. Elvet Lewis, 1940 and 1949, Hugh Redwood, 1928-32, Mrs. A. Seymour Rees, 1948 (mainly relating to her reminiscences of Caradoc Evans), Edward Thomas ('Cochfarf'), 1911, G. Brynallt Williams, 1962, Huw Menai Williams, 1917, 1948 and 1951-2, and Rev Moses Williams, Erith, Kent, 1936-7. The remainder of the letters are single items from Edward Cadbury, 1926, Hugh Cadbury, 1928, Tom Clarke, 1927, Anna Davies, Tenby, 1927 (the painting of 'Salem'), E. Vaughan Davies, Cardiff, 1926, Sir Arthur Conan Doyle, 1919 (spiritual seance), D. R. Griffiths ('Amanwy'), 1949, Stuart Hodgson, 1932, Jack Jones, Rhiwbina, 1949, Sir Walter Layton, 1931, J. Eddie Parry, Llanelli, 1939, T. H. Parry-Williams, 1949, and J. Robinson, Lord Mayor of Cardiff, 1914 (letter of identity for use in London in case of difficulty because of the suffragette outrages). There are also photographs of Eluned Morgan and some of her relatives and her home in Gaiman, of members of the Gorsedd at Llanelli National Eisteddfod, 1903, and of the ship 'Terra Nova' (in which Captain Scott had sailed for the South Pole) returning to Cardiff, and printed matter relating to the revival of 1904-5.

Family and estate papers. The greater part of the archive consists of correspondence, rentals, accounts, industrial records, and miscellaneous papers relating to numerous Carmarthenshire families and their estates. Cardigan, Williams of Meysydd-hirion, parish of Llandilo-fawr, Williams of Tredarren, parish of Conwil Elvet, and Miss Elizabeth Williams of the Parade, Carmarthen.

Records of the Church in Wales. These papers relate mainly to the diocese of St. Davids, but a substantial proportion relate to church property in other parts of Wales and to the activities of the Governing and Representative Bodies. Among the documents relating to education are a report, 1809, on Mrs. Bevan's Welsh Circulating Charity Schools; papers, 1851-3, touching a proposal to move St. David's College from Lampeter to Brecon; and papers relating to Trinity College, Queen Elizabeth's Grammar School, and High School, all at Carmarthen, and Ystrad Meurig United School. Of historical interest are sequestration papers relating to Ebenezer Morris, vicar of Llanelly, 1843, and correspondence, etc., of the Historical Society of the Church in Wales. Stafford, 1787 (with note of probate, 1789), James Beavan of the parish of Clirow, 1823 (with note of probate, 1824), Mary Beavan of the parish of Clirow, 1823, and Thomas Thomas of Pencerrig, co. Radnor, 1857; and copies of the marriage settlements of the Reverend Richard Venables and Sophia Lister, 1808, and Rev Richard Lister Venables and Mrs. Dalrymple Adam, 1834.

Diaries of Richard Venables, 1808-15, 1817-20, 1822-4 (15 volumes, some by inference); diaries of Richard Lister Venables, 1828-53, 1861-4, 1866-93 (79 volumes); journals of George Stovin Venables, 1839-83 (13 volumes); diaries of Mary H. Venables, 1809, 1813, 1820, 1834; and miscellaneous diaries, 1768-1857, many possibly those of George Stovin Venables (23 volumes).

Five bundles of notes of sermons preached, 1836-81, by Richard Lister Venables. The bundles are numbered 1-4 and 6, bundle 5, presumably covering the period 1866-?71, being missing.

An incomplete holograph draft of Richard Lister Venables's volume *Domestic Scenes in Russia in a Series of Letters describing a Year's Residence in that Country chiefly in the Interior* (London, 1839).

The extant manuscript pages contain the material to be found in the table of contents and on pp. 1-134, 187-264, and 304-49 of the first edition. Also included is a draft version of the preface to the second edition published in 1856.

Material of interest to Newbridge-on-Wye church and school, including letters, etc., 1874-7, relating to the proposed formation of an ecclesiastical district at Newbridge (10 items); letters, etc., 1875, relating to the erection of an iron church at Newbridge (13 items); letters and drafts and copies of letters, 1878-9, relating to the proposed appointment of a curate to serve the Newbridge district (21 items); copies of the *London Gazette*, letters and copies of letters, plans, vouchers, etc., 1881-3 and undated, relating to a proposal to build a new church and create an ecclesiastical district at Newbridge (259 items); and letters, etc., 1901-5 and undated, relating to Newbridge school (50 items).

Some 440 letters 1810-57 and undated, addressed to [Archdeacon] Richard Venables, being mainly from solicitors and members of his family and dealing largely with personal, legal, and business matters.

Some 370 letters, 1837-88, from Richard Lister Venables to his brother George Stovin Venables. These relate mainly to personal, family, and business affairs including the writer's visit to Russia, 1837-8, but also occasionally to local news (Pantmawr lead mine, Rhaeadr, 1857; local reaction to the Education Act, 1870; the proposed choice of recipient as parliamentary candidate for Radnor

boroughs, 1879), and to current political topics (Cobden and free trade, 1846; O'Connell's speech and the Coercion Bill, 1846; universal suffrage, 1848; Chartism, 1848; election news, 1852; etc.).

Some 420 letters, 1845-88 and undated, but mainly 1880s, from George Stovin Venables to his brother Richard Lister Venables. These deal mainly with personal and business matters, but there are frequent references in the 1880s to governmental policy, ministerial changes, etc., with mention of personalities such as Gladstone, Randolph Churchill, and others. Five of the letters were written whilst the writer was on a visit to Spain, Gibraltar, etc.

Nearly 600 letters, 1835-93 and undated, to R. Lister Venables from members of his family and others and a further group of 178 letters, 1868-93 and undated, by inference to the same recipient. These again, whilst dealing mainly with personal and family matters, also contain references to current parliamentary and political affairs, etc.

Some 550 letters, ?1831-88, to George Stovin Venables, the writers including W. Adam, Lord Ashburton, H. M. Ashburton, L. Ashburton, T. G. Baring, Wm. Baring, W. H. Brookfield, G. Bunsen, J. T. Delane, Aubrey de Vere, E. H. Doyle, John Forster, W.V. Harcourt, A. Hayward, Arthur Helps, Lord Hereford, Lord Houghton, E. Lushington, F. Lushington, H. S. Maine, Theodore Martin, C. Merivale, R. M. Milnes, the Duke of Newcastle, Coventry Patmore, E. H. Pember, F. Pember, J. G. Phillimore, W. F. Pollock, H. Reeve, G. K. Rickard, John Simeon, James Spedding, Alfred Tennyson, Emily Tennyson, Hallam Tennyson, W. H. Thompson, W[illiam Thomson, archbishop of York], G. O. Trevelyan, Edward Twisleton, A. M. Venables (sister-in-law), J. H. Venables (brother), M. A. D. Venables (sister-in-law), Richard Venables (father), and Sophia Venables (mother). The letters are largely social and personal, some reflect the legal activities of recipient, and some the literary or historical activities of recipient and/or writer. There are also references to current political events and personalities.

385 letters, 1850-93 and undated, to 'Venables' or 'Mr. Venables', the majority of those dated prior to 1888 being presumably letters to George Stovin Venables. The writers include Lord Acton, Matthew Arnold, H. M. Ashburton, L. Ashburton, Lord Blachford, Robert Browning, J. Bryce, Lord Carnarvon, T. Carlyle, Lord Coleridge, Aubrey de Vere, M. E. The depositor has considerably enhanced their value by providing explanatory information and details of family background.

The twenty-five volumes of printed books include, among others, Richard Bloome: *Brittania* (London, 1673); William Salmon: *Botanologia* (London, 1710); *A description of all the cities & borough towns in England and Wales . . . with their arms & common seals . . .* (London: Printed for Geo: Bickam [17-]); and Thomas Pennant: *A tour in Wales* (2 vols. London, 1784). Volume II of the latter contains manuscript additions and corrections on slips and sheets of paper which appear to be in the hand of the author. They were inserted, according to a note at the beginning of the volume, dated at Calcutta 27 October 1788, by Robert Chambers, who received them as waste paper used in packing books sent to him from England.
