During recent research work, the Abbey has been slowly revealing the full extent of the original design following the Lord Rhys' re-foundation in 1184. It was on a grand scale and incorporated a number of unique features for a Cistercian Abbey. These extend the meaning of the place back in time and left a strong legacy for the future. The talk will showcase current evidence for a hypothesis that the intention of Lord Rhys and the monks was to create a 'national' institution as one component of a wider ambition for Wales.

Hedd Wyn, the young poet from Trawsfynydd, was killed in the trenches one hundred years ago, before he was proclaimed Chaired Poet of the 1917 National Eisteddfod. He became a symbol in Wales and across Europe of the waste and horror of the Great War.

Using film and experimental techniques, this new show by Ifor ap Glyn, National Poet of looks at Hedd Wyn's life and works alongside other WWI poets, exploring the themes of loss and identity.



As the Welsh Government invests in science and scientists to make Wales a smart country based on a knowledge economy, it is timely to examine gender, power and knowledge in the Welsh Academy.
